



WHY THE BEGINNING OF A LESSON MATTERS

THE LESSON STARTER:

CAPTURES AT

ATTENTION

ACTIVATES PRIOR KNOWLEDGE

SETS CLASSROOM ENERGY

PREPARES STUDENTS EMOTIONALLY

BUILDS CURIOSITY

A STRONG START LOWERS THE AFFECTIVE FILTER AND INCREASES READINESS TO LEARN.

# The Psychology Behind Strong Lesson Openings

01 Activates prior knowledge



02 Builds curiosity

03 Lowers affective filter

04 Increases participation

05 Sets behavioral expectations

Research shows that attention is highest at the beginning of a session.



# STARTER ACTIVITY – “SLEEP & WAKE UP” GAME



## How It Works

The teacher says “Sleep!”  
Students put their heads down and pretend to sleep.  
The teacher secretly turns over one picture on the board.  
board.

The teacher says “Wake up!”  
Students must identify which picture has been turned over.

# Why “Sleep” Is an Effective Starter



Activates visual memory  
Trains concentration  
Revises vocabulary  
Builds suspense  
Engages the whole class

# Methodological Value of the Starter

**From a cognitive perspective, the activity:**

**Encourages quick recall**

**Strengthens working memory**

**It moves students from passive mode to active mode.**

**Develops observation skills**


**A well-designed starter is not entertainment — it is cognitive preparation.**

# Why Lesson Closures Matter

“Now that we have explored how to start a lesson effectively, let us move to the equally important question — how should we end it?”



The lesson ending:  
Reinforces learning  
Checks understanding  
Builds retention  
Provides feedback  
Creates a sense of achievement



# **Closer Activity – “Tense Chairs” Game**

**Two chairs are placed at the front:**

**One for Present Simple  
One for Past Simple**

**Two students come to the board.**

**The teacher says a verb form.  
If it is past simple → students sit on the Past chair.**

**If it is present → they sit on the Present chair.**

**The activity continues with different verbs.**

# Why This Works as a Closer

- 01 Revises irregular verbs
  - 02 Checks tense recognition
  - 03 Encourages automaticity
  - 04 Functions as formative assessment
  - 05 Ends the lesson with energy
- It allows the teacher to instantly identify misunderstandings.

# Cognitive and Pedagogical Analysis

This closer is powerful because it includes:

- ✓ Retrieval practice
- ✓ Dual coding (hearing + movement)
- ✓ Kinesthetic learning
- ✓ Rapid grammatical recognition


Students are not reviewing passively — they are retrieving knowledge under time pressure.

That strengthens long-term retention.



# Making the Closer Even Stronger

To deepen learning, we  
can add reflection:  
After the game, ask:



**Which verbs were the most difficult?  
Why are some verbs irregular?**



**What pattern did you notice?**

**Now the closer becomes:**



- ✓ **Energetic**
- ✓ **Reflective**
- ✓ **Diagnostic**



◇ **Starter**

**A lesson starter:**

**Activates prior knowledge**

**Builds energy**

**Creates curiosity**

**Prepares students for  
learning**

**It sets the tone of the lesson  
and mentally prepares  
students for new input.**



◇ **Closer**

**A lesson closer:**

**Consolidates knowledge**

**Checks understanding**

**Strengthens retention**

**Confirms learning**

**It helps students**

**process what they have**



**learned and gives the**
